11. Significant contributions made by IQAC during the current year (maximum five bullets)

IQAC took following intiatives: 1. We are empanelled with Tally Education Private Ltd., Bengaluru as a sole training & assessment center in the city to offer certifications on Tally, Accounting software. The primary objective of this course is to impart practical skills for the preparation of different accounts/procedure that includes invoicing, receipt notes, inventory management, sale records, and credit notes. 2. The college established a formal collaboration with Bajaj Finserv to help facilitate the placement process and ensure that students gain valuable practical knowledge regarding workplace skills in banking and insurance sector. 3. The college has introduced five skill-based job-oriented courses under the affiliation of Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University, Patiala to provide technical, practical or industry specific skills, to complement core academic qualification of students by increasing their competitiveness for securing employment in their desired field/job market. These courses are Certificate programme in GST Application, Certificate course in Accounting and Taxation, Certificate/Diploma course in Food Preservation, Certificate course in Creative Writing and Content Development, Certificate/Diploma course in Office Automation and E-Governance. 4. Alumnae Association has been registered as a formal entity, enhancing its credibility and ensuring compliance with legal regulations. Aim is to promote lifelong engagement with its alumnae for organizing activities, facilitating communication, and getting support and fostering a vibrant alumni community that will be beneficial to all the stakeholders as well as the institute. 5. IQAC enthuses faculty to take research initiatives for the quality enhancement. During the year a Minor Project on "The Contract Marriages in Punjab-The Socio, Economic, Cultural and Psychological Consequences" of Dr. Anupam Sabharwal has been sanctioned by ICSSR with a grant of Rs. 350000.

15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Our college is affiliated with Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and runs various streams viz: Humanities, commerce and IT. Different departments of the college are offering interdisciplinary elective papers to students as part of their curriculum. The college absolutely adheres to and follows the course structure and curriculum as approved by the University.

Though, currently our college is not offering a multidisciplinary flexible curriculum in UG and PG programs as per the guidelines of affiliating university but the College has all the required expertise to implement the curricula and integrate between Humanities, commerce and IT. We will provide a multidisciplinary flexible curriculum and implement in letter and spirit the curriculum and course structure as designed by the University as per NEP2020.

Apart from this students are also given the option to take interdisciplinary benefits by getting enrolled in value-added, hobby and skill enhancement courses run by different departments like English, Computers, Commerce, and Cosmetology.

The integration of Indian knowledge systems into education is achieved by incorporating the teaching of Indian languages as a part of the college curriculum and linguistic expressions. The college has 3 Language departments (i) Hindi (ii) Punjabi (iii) English which defines and narrate Indian Culture, Knowledge System and traditional ethos to the students along with other topics. The promotion of the Hindi and Punjabi languages as well as the fusion of the Indian Knowledge System with the modern education system is accomplished through the arena of famous stories and poems of Indian writers depicting Indian culture and value system, teaching Indian scriptures like Ram Charit Manas, Bani of Gurus', regional level culture and folklore, a celebration of national language day (Hindi Protsahan Saptah) and International Mother Tongue Day(Punjabi). Department of social sciences like History educates the students through its curriculum and by visiting different historical places and

museums(https://www.hindukanyacollege.com/activities/-educationaltour-) that highlight India as a trove of culture developed over thousands of years and manifested in the form of arts, works of literature, customs and traditions, artefacts, heritage sites, and many more. The students of Philosophy through their syllabi learn different philosophical theories on Indian thoughts, values and ethics like Buddhism, Jainism, Sikhism, Shaivism etc. Department of Music connects students with Indian culture and heritage through different Ragas. The college also hosts workshops on Yoga to promote ancient techniques for maintaining physical and mental health. Moral, ethical and Indian values are instilled through havan yajnas, cultural events, and extension lectures of the luminaries. The college library also has many books on Indian history, prominent religious places of India, Vedas, Upanishads and other scriptures. Students can easily access the biographies of notable Indian scholars. In the coming times, the college is committed to facilitating a seamless integration of Indian traditional knowledge with modern subjects as per UGC/affiliating university guidelines,

when received, in accordance with NEP 2020. It will aim to make our youth aware of the vast repositories of ancient traditional knowledge in India; map knowledge with modern scientific advancements and technologies and link Indian art and culture with the teaching learning process. To inspire and guide the faculty to generate a positive attitude, explore, and undertake quality research on the Indian Knowledge system, induction programmes and faculty development programs will also be organised.

The college has completely adopted the outcome-based curriculum framework and will implement the program structure and curriculum in letter and spirit approved by affiliating University in the future. 1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The college ensures effective implementation of the syllabus prescribed by the parent university. The workload of every department is evaluated prior to the commencement of the academic session so that the posts are filled in time, if any. Time Table committee prepares and displays class-wise and subject-wise timetables.

For effective planning of the curriculum, semester-wise unitization of the syllabus is uploaded on the website and its PDF is shared by the class coordinators at the time of admission so that they get familiar and connect with their syllabus before the session begins(https://www.hindukanyacollege.com/unitization). Hard copies of the syllabi are provided in the library also.

Faculty members use different teaching pedagogies along with chalk and talk methods todeliver the lectures effectivelyfor the time-bound completion of the syllabus. They use various ICT tools,

organise seminars, workshops, group discussions, quizzes and administer tests. Google Classroom is used by teachers to share study materials, lecture-based Google forms and assignments. WhatsApp Group of each class is created by the class coordinators to develop rapport and a platform for the students to address their queries and information regarding forthcoming events with the students.

Documentation of the covered syllabi is done by preparing teaching plan diaries, syllabus completion reports and monthly reports, filled by teachers confining details of chapters covered, tests conducted, assignments given and seminars organized.

The college follows the university schedule and creates its own academic calendar as per the university calendar (https://www.hindukanyacollege.com/academiccalendar) which is a part of the College Prospectus. In the meetings of the Heads of the Departments with the Principal, academic planning of the entire session regarding proposed co-academic activities, teaching days, vacation schedules and Pre-Semester examinations is done.

Teachers are directed to cover a minimum of 90% syllabus for Pre-Semester exams and question papers are set strictly according to the university pattern. Departmental Heads randomly check answer sheets to ensure qualitative evaluation and give suggestive remarks. Answer sheets are distributed and question papers are discussed with students in the classrooms. Teachers tap on the slow learners and advanced learners and guide them accordingly. Comprehensive assessment of student performance is analysed and supervised continuously and consistently through class tests, seminars and projects also.

In practical subjects like Home Science, Cosmetology, Fashion Designing etc., the performance of students is continuously evaluated based on some pre-defined parameters by the department concerned. Lecture-based Google form questionnaires are also conducted to assess the performance of students which provide required feedback to improve their performance.

Teachers improve students' interest in theoretical lessons by involving them in practical activities keeping in mind learners' abilities, interests, and experiences, thereby encouraging learning by doing. Different departments of the college run certificate and add-on courses. Students are motivated to participate in different activities such as seminars, group discussions, role-play, subject-based quizzes, story telling, debate, Entrepreneurial Development Programmeand Management event to explore, interact, share views and ideas, learn in groups and observe.

The College organizes industrial visits, field trips, Guest lectures from industry/academics and workshops to augment classroom learning. 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The college follows a proper mechanism to conduct internal assessments for evaluating students' knowledge, subject clarity and overall performance. Internal assessment is done at various levels through Pre-Semester Examinations, class tests, assignments, projects, lecture-based Google forms, question-answer sessions, interaction with students, practicals etc.

A House Examination Committee headed by the Registrar coordinates the conduct and evaluation of internal examinations. The evaluation-related grievances are also held in a systematic way, through the college portal.

College pays due importance to make the internal assessment procedures transparent and robust. Teachers discuss students' performance thoroughly in class and apprise them about their shortcomings and areas of betterment. In the subjects where internal assessment is proposed by the university or practical

scores are to be considered, the concerned department sets the parameters of assessment which are duly communicated to the students at the beginning of the semester. The whole process is carried out in a well-planned manner.

As far as the frequency and mode of various assessment tools is concerned, class tests, assignments, projects, lecture-based Google-form, practicals etc are conducted weekly or monthly in blended mode, whereas Pre-Semester Examinations are conducted twice a year before the University Examination in offline mode.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

Examination-related grievances are handled online by the College through its portal. Each registered student of the college is provided with a Login Id through which she can access the studentsrelated facilities section of the portal. Results of house examinations are also shown in this section.

If a student is unsatisfied with the scores given, she can submit her grievance, then and there, within three days of the uploading of results. After the submission of the grievance, a token number is generated by the system for the reference of the students. It is directed to students to submit their answer sheet to the examination clerk with the mention of the portal-generated token number on the sheet.

The registrar then collects all the answer sheets, evaluates the grievances, and takes the necessary action. Registrar may get the answer sheet re-evaluated by another teacher in case the student is not satisfied with the evaluation. The college tries to resolve the examination-related grievances within three working days from the submission of the grievance. Students are also intimated after resolving their grievances, personally by the team of the House ExaminationCommittee and by uploading revised results on the portal.

Once the examination process is completed the Principal keeps the check on the status of all the grievances and guides the House

Examination Committee to remove discrepancies, if any.

Eco-System for Innovation is promoted through Research and Development Cell fostering research culture and encouraging teachers to upgrade academic qualifications by attending workshops, FDPs and MOOC courses. Besides these, the N.list facility is also provided to the researchers.

The college runs short-term skill-based certificate and diploma courses and has created Industry-Institute partnerships and tieups with Jagat Guru Nanak Dev Punjab State Open University, Bajaj FinServ, and Tally consultants for nurturing micro-entrepreneurial skills. Value Added Courses in English, Commerce, Computer Science, Home Science, Fashion Designing and Cosmetology are run besides regular courses to train students according to current industrial requirements.

Students have been engaged in different activities, fostering the entrepreneurship culture through structured and non-structured Entrepreneurial Development Programmmes such as "Naye Uddhami Pehli Udaan" and 'Business Fest' by the PG Department of Commerce; Handicraft Mela/ Exhibition cum Sales Counter established by the Department of Fashion Designing under the project "Earn While You Learn" and Mehandi stalls arranged by the Cosmetology Department.

3.4 - Extension Activities

3.4.1 - Extension activities are carried out in the neighborhood community, sensitizing students to social issues, for their holistic development, and impact thereof during the year

The College has observed that residents of the nearby villages adopted by NSS units, lack health awareness, hygienic living conditions, and awareness about deadly diseases like AIDS and

environment-related issues. NSS volunteers undertook several activities in these villages like tree plantation, a 2-day cleanliness drive and Nukkad Natak on the theme of educating girl children. Besides these, a camp was also organized on December 2 to familiarise villagers with voting using VVPAT, in collaboration with district administration. Voters were appealed to cast their votes through door-to-door visits. Volunteers also cleaned the nearby public park i.e., Shalimar Bagh and showed the importance of community hygiene to the public. World AIDS Day was observed by NSS, in collaboration with health authorities. Students were made aware of the myths associated with this chronic disease. NCC cadets, under the drive 'Swachhta Bharat Abhiyaan' cleaned the statue of Shaheed Bhagat Singh situated in the heart of the city. Cadets commemorated Martyr's Day of Bhagat Singh by paying obeisanceto the Shaheed who sacrificed his life for the country. Cadets also participated in a nationwide sanitation activity organised at Kanjali Wetland, impacting the thought process of society to live healthy and hygienic life. The Red Cross Unit and NSS Units of the college organized COVID Vaccination Camps on campus and ensured everyone gotvaccinated to combat the deadly disease.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college is in pollution-free vicinity adjacent to Shalimar Bagh. It encompasses over 2.5 acres of land and has 44 airy and spacious classrooms. The college has 5 Hi-Tech computer labs and fully equipped labs for Home Science (Two), Fashion Designing (Three), Communication Skills (One), Music (Two), Cosmetology (One), and an IQAC Room. The departments of English, Punjabi, Social Sciences, Commerce, Hindi, Computer Science and IT have separate department rooms. Department of Commerce and Computer Science and IT have maintained separate departmental libraries for their students. A desktop with internet connectivity is also provided to these departments. The college has two smart rooms equipped with audio-visual aids, overhead, and LCD projectors.

Three of the rooms from the Commerce Department are equipped with ICT facilities for the teaching-learning process. The college has an updated computerized Library, which is a rich repository of the latest learning resources with access to e-resources of N-LIST which is a part of the E-ShodhSindhu consortium of INFLIBNET. A separate Archive Section is also there in Library. AReading Room is also there, where students can sit and study during their free periods.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

Our college houses adequate facilities and physical infrastructure for arranging games, cultural and fitness activities. Due to the shortage of space within the campus, public grounds are used for outdoor games. During the present session, training related to athletics was given to the students who participated in the 100-meter race in Inter College competition. Generally, our college sports students participate in District/College/ University level competitions, but due to COVID-19, the team could not be framed. The college also organized an Inter-Class Tug of War competition on 3rd March 2022 and sports events on 1st April 2022 in which students participated in different races and athletic games. The college gymnasium/Yoga centre is maintained with machines and exercise tools for carrying out fitness activities. This year, from 26th October to 11th November 2021, Yoga classes were arranged for students. The college provides special incentives like fee concessions, mess, and hostel facilities to its sports students. Besides these, balls, net, rope, badminton rackets etc. are also provided to the students. A spacious multipurpose hall named Madalsa Bhawan along with a green room facility is used to showcase students' talents in the events like dance, drama, songs, mime etc. A fully air-conditioned, ICTenabled Conference Hall is used to organize seminars, conferences and workshops to complement the teaching and learning process. The college has various musical instruments, sound systems and music systems to facilitate the students to participate in different cultural events within or outside the college.

The operation of the college library is assisted by Campus Analyzer version 3.5, an Integrated Library Automation Software by Contemporary Software Services Pvt. Ltd., Mohali. It simplifies the entire daily library housekeeping operations such as Membership, Accessioning, Circulation, OPAC and report generation. Accessioning becomes very simple as new books get entered into the software along with all its relevant information like title, author(s), edition, publisher, seller party, price, call number and many more. 4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The college observes a set procedure which includes taking permission from management, inviting quotations, verification of prices, quality of items etc. to update and maintain physical, academic and support facilities. Regular maintenance of electrical equipment, water coolers, classrooms, corridors, canteen, common room, lawns, transportation and the first-aid room is done by the College Caretaker and the Support-staff. The Caretaker checks regularly the complaints related to the infrastructure in an infrastructure complaint register kept in the administrativeoffice.

To improve the academic resources and to fulfill the readers' demands, the College Library is being regularly updated. The library advisory committee keeps a constant watch over the updates of the library stock and the proper utility of the reading material. Departmental Libraries are also maintained to cater their reader's subject-specific reading material.

In IT department, a Coordinator checks the requirements, utilization, and maintenance of resources. The college has hired the services of Hardware and software technicians for the smooth functioning of ICT equipment. A regular annual stock checking is conducted to keep a proper record of the inventories and equipment maintained by the departmental labs of Music, Home Science, Fine Arts, Physical Education and Computer Science. A report is compiled annually elaborating the repair plan, writing off or weeding out, and purchase of new items.

The classrooms remain occupied for the whole day for teaching programmes. Smart classrooms are used not only for lectures but also for audio-visual presentationslike showing syllabi-related movies or exemplary documentary movies .
