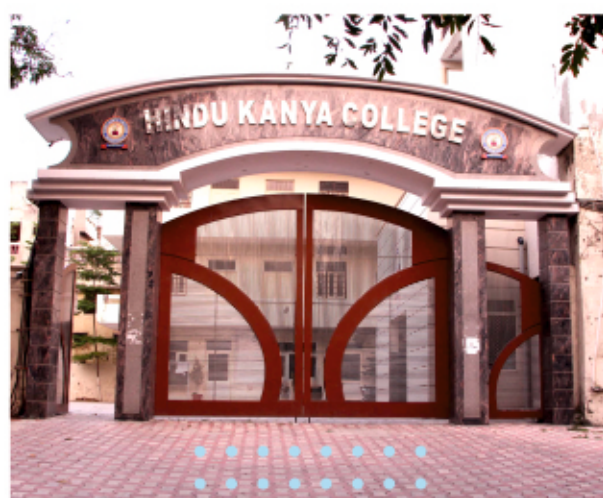

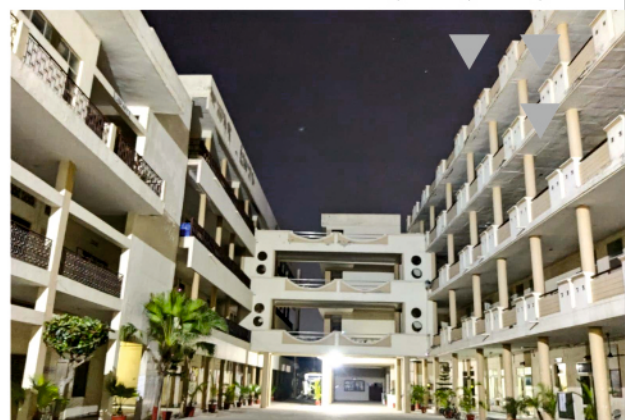
INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES, SUPPORT SERVICES AND HEALTHY PRACTICES

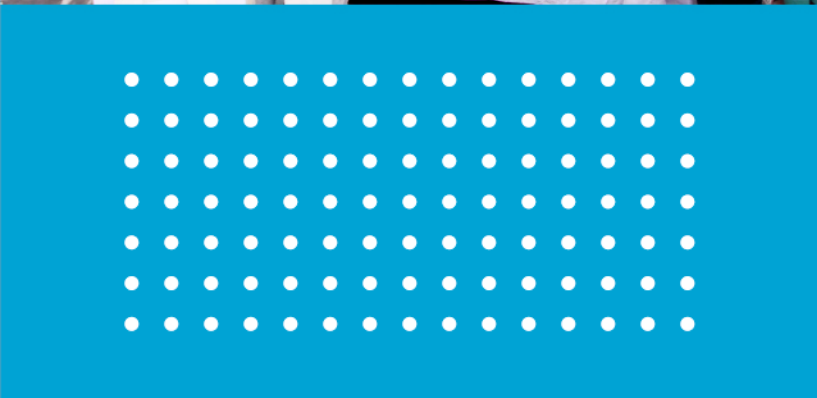
B) LEARNING RESOURCES

The college has fully enriched centralized library which includes over 30270 books in accession and book bank. A wide range of journals, e-journals, newspapers and magazines are also available in the college library. Library offers Wi-Fi connectivity for internet surfing for students.

Besides main library, there are Departmental Libraries and a Reading Room which are an extension to College Main Library. It remains open from 9:00 a.m. to 4 p.m. on all working days. They maintain Archives Section too. Library offers separate PG section with open book shelf provision.

Book Bank facility is also there to provide free books to the needy and deserving students for the session.

Reprography facility, UGC Resource Centre and Membership of INFLIBNET UGC, INFONET, E-Journals Consortium programme are the other features of College library.



C) SUPPORT SERVICES

Students' Council comprising Head Girl, Vice Head Girl, Prefects and Class Representatives from all streams and all classes is formed to inculcate the values of staunch leadership, healthy team spirit, self-discipline and sense of responsibility among the elected members of the council.

- Morning Assembly, a noteworthy feature of our college, commences with the recitation of college song/prayer and ends with the National Anthem. Students and teachers deliver sublime thoughts and short speeches to observe the special days of the year to bring awareness among students.
- Some special appreciation awards and honours are instituted to nurture the qualities like honesty, simplicity, truthfulness, punctuality and volunteering for service among our college girls.
- Election of Class Representatives, Students Council, Prefectorial Board to develop leadership qualities among the students is another endeavour on the part of college authorities, to enable the students to initiate, to plan, to manage, to decide and to act independently.

Saraswati Award is given to a student who has topped in Annual Examination consecutively for five years (For two years as a student of Hindu Kanya Collegiate School and for three years in Hindu Kanya College, Kapurthala and Gargi Award is given to a student who has topped in Annual Examination consecutively for three years in degree classes.
- Ragging free atmosphere is provided in the college to make the students feel friendly and frank with the seniors. To strengthen this feeling juniors are welcomed. In this special session, meditation and exercise sessions are arranged to relieve stress and mental anxiety caused due to social disparity and varied family backgrounds.

This garden is aesthetically maintained by using used empty plastic bottles to preserve the herbs, which further promotes innovative recycling of the plastic bottles and teach students various novel techniques of gardening and preservation of plants.

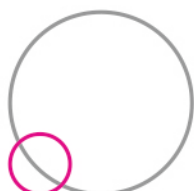

(Note: If a student fails to submit the migration certificate on the prescribed dates, she shall be personally responsible for delay in registration, admission and results.)

(Note: At the time of admission the students must carry all the testimonials in original for verification.)

PLEASE NOTE

1. Admission to the college is made provisionally at the sole risk and responsibility of the candidate and is subject to the approval of Guru Nanak Dev University. If the admission is withheld due to any reason, the student shall bear the whole responsibility and will not be entitled to any claim from the college.
2. Late admission will be permitted only if the seats are available and university rules permit.
3. A student seeking provisional admission subject to the production of eligibility certificate later on will do so at her own risk and responsibility. The students are advised to produce the eligibility certificate as early as possible (not more than 14 days after admission) in their own interest, otherwise their provisional admission will be deemed as cancelled.
4. For 'Result Late' cases, any student whose result is declared 'Later on' by the Board/University, may seek admission without late fee within ten days after the declaration of the results, if university permits.

6. A foreign student must possess 'Student Visa' before admission. Student coming on 'Tourist Visa' will not be admitted unless they produce approval of Government of India.
7. In case, there is any change in correspondence/ residential address/phone numbers, it should be intimated to the college office immediately to avoid any communication gap/failure in future.
8. All students will be issued their personal IDs and passwords to access college website at the start of classes.

RULES RELATED TO BASIC PUNJABI IN LIEU OF GENERAL PUNJABI

Candidates relating to any of the following categories shall be allowed to select Basic Punjabi in place of Punjabi Compulsory subject at under-graduate level. Such candidates shall submit an affidavit (Specimen enclosed) of the value of Rs. 15/- attested by Local Executive Magistrate. In case the candidates are non-residents of Punjab State, they shall submit domicile certificate of the state concerned duly appeased from the competent authority. The Principal of the College/Head of the Department shall keep the affidavit/domicile certificate in record and certify the concerned category at the time of submitting Registration Returns to the University.

- f. The candidates who have migrated to this university before or after passing B.A. /B. Com Part-I examination and have not studied Punjabi Compulsory subject in the previous University may also select Basic Punjabi Subject in place of Punjabi Compulsory.

UNIVERSITY GUIDELINES FOR SEMESTER PROMOTION

COURSES HAVING TWO SEMESTER DURATION:

- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
- In case a student fails to pass all the courses/papers within a period of two semesters (One Year), she shall be given two consecutive semesters (One Year) more to pass.

COURSES HAVING FOUR SEMESTER DURATION:

- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
- However, the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- In case a student fails to pass all the courses/papers within a period of four semesters (Two Years), she shall be given four consecutive semesters (Two Years) more to pass.

COURSES HAVING SIX SEMESTER DURATION:

- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
- However, the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if she has passed at least 30% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- However, a student shall be promoted to fifth semester only if she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first four semesters.
- The student shall be promoted to sixth semester only if she has passed all the papers of the first semester. After a period of six semesters the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.

CHANGE IN SYLLABUS OR ELIGIBILITY

CONDITION : There can be any change in condition or syllabus during the session as per the notification of G.N.D. U. Amritsar. Students should check the syllabus from Library.

CHANGE OF SUBJECTS : A student may be permitted to change her subjects/ stream within fifteen days from the commencement of the session. The permission to change any subject should be sought on the prescribed form available in the administrative office. It should be signed by the concerned teachers but the change would be permitted subject to availability of seats in the concerned course/subject.

RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL

The student, who wants to withdraw her name from the college rolls, must apply in writing to the principal. The application must be signed by her father or guardian. No student will be permitted to leave the college until she has cleared all her college dues.

Students who fail to deposit their Migration Certificate in time before the commencement of Exams will be issued Provisional Roll No. Slip after paying fees of Rs 500/- along with Self Attested Affidavit.

They will be given one month duration to submit their Original Migration Certificate. After one month the defaulters will be charged late fees of Rs 500/- per month and late fees will not exceed Rs 2500/-. Moreover, non- submitters will not be allowed to fill in the next semester form.

If there is a mistake in the DMC/ Degree on the part of the University, then student has to pay correction fees of Rs/- 500 and submit Original DMC/Degree as soon as possible to get a new Original DMC/Degree. And if there is a mistake on the part of College/ Student, then student has to pay Rs 1000/- per certificate along with correction fees of Rs 500/- to get a new Original DMC/Degree.



RULES FOR PRE-SEMESTER EXAMINATION

1. To assess and evaluate the progress of the students, Pre-Semester examinations are held twice during the session.
2. A student absenting herself from Pre-Semester examinations without prior permission will be fined heavily and can also be detained from appearing in University Examination.
3. Exemption from an examination on account of illness or any other special reason must be sought personally from the registrar.
4. In case a student falls sick during examination days, leave application supported by Medical Certificate should be submitted to the registrar immediately. No leave application will be entertained after the examination is over.
5. A student who has taken exemption in pre semester examination on medical or any other ground will have to appear in re - test, to be eligible for semester examination.
6. The students can apply for Re- Evaluation by clicking on the link provided on the college website for the redressal of any dispute/grievance regarding evaluation of sheets within 3 days after answer sheets are shown in classes. No request shall be entertained after the allotted time of 3 days. Students having grievances must submit their answer sheets to Examination Clerk, Mr.Sanjeev Sharma.Students can check their revised results on the college website after 3 days of filing their grievance.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR APPEARING IN SEMESTER EXAMINATION

1. A student must attend at least 75% of the total lectures delivered in each subject. Lectures in Theory and Practical will be counted separately.
2. A student must obtain at least 25% marks in aggregate in Pre-semester Examinations.
3. Detainees List on the basis of Attendance and Result of Pre-semester Examinations will be displayed fifteen days before the final semester examinations.
4. It is compulsory for students to attend three weeks internship in the courses where there is assessment.

1. The students, who are interested in availing financial aid, have to obtain a prescribed form from Mr. Sanjeev Sharma in the office and appear for interview on the date fixed by the Principal.
2. The dates for the interview will be notified later on.
3. In case a student fails to appear in the interview on the notified dates, she will not be given any concession later on.
4. The Financial aid being given to the student will be withdrawn if:
 - (a) The student fails to attend 75% of the Lectures delivered in the class.
 - (b) The student fails in any subject in the House Examination or Final Examination.

RULES FOR FEE CONCESSION

1. Fee concessions/stipends/scholarships are liable to be withdrawn without a warning if a student deteriorates in studies, remains irregular or is found guilty of misconduct or misbehaviour.
2. If a student enjoying concession/stipends/scholarship migrates or leaves the college before appearing in the University Examination, she will be required to surrender the entire amount paid to her by way of concession by the college.
3. The fee concession granted by the college will be adjusted in the last installment of fee supposed to be paid in the month of April 2022.

Note: Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/ Backward Classes students may apply for scholarship online during the dates prescribed by Welfare Department, Govt. of India on the given Website for online application.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

IT IS MANDATORY FOR THE STUDENTS TO HAVE GOT TWO DOSES OF COVID VACCINATION

1. Students must wear uniform on the prescribed day otherwise they will be heavily fined.
2. All students must read the Notice Board daily to get apprised with the latest instructions/rules/orders. Ignorance of rules will not be an excuse.
3. Students can put their suggestions or complaints in the Suggestion Box.
4. Students must possess Identity Card and produce whenever asked otherwise they will be fined.
5. College timings are from 9 am to 4 pm, the first period will start at 9 am daily and each period shall be of 40 minutes.
6. Students may contact the Principal on any working day during the hours fixed for the purpose.
7. They should keep the college Identity Card with them while attending the college.
8. Rules regarding Dress Code for students:-
Monday :
In Summer: - White Salwar, Kameez with White Muslin Dupatta.
In Winter: - White Salwar, Kameez with Maroon Sweater, White Muslin Dupatta.
Other Days : Any decent wearing dress like jeans with decent top, suits etc.
9. The students should be punctual in attending their classes. Late comers will be marked absent even though the teacher concerned may permit them to enter the class at her or his discretion.
10. It is compulsory for all to attend the morning assembly.
11. It is obligatory for the students to attend college functions, especially when they are informed in advance.
12. Every student should consider herself as a custodian of the college and must conduct herself both inside and outside the college with a decorum and dignity that is worthy of her institution.
13. Every student should protect the college property. Students spoiling the desks or walls with pencils, chalks, knives and markers etc. tampering with fan regulators and switchboards will be liable to disciplinary action, even expulsion from the college.
14. Students are instructed not to use cosmetics, wear jewellery, gaudy dresses and skin tight clothes, sleeveless and low-neck shirts. They are also not permitted to possess cameras, cheap books or magazines in their bags.
15. The students are expected to be courteous and polite while dealing with the clerical staff, menial staff, fellow students and visitors in the college.
16. The students should develop the habit of forming queue while paying dues or fee, getting books from the library, going to see their teachers in staff room or even while entering the class rooms.
17. Students should use the dustbins and should co-operate in keeping the campus, classrooms, lawns and laboratories neat and clean.

- II. The parents can meet the teachers during their free periods or during the Assembly Period with prior appointment.

LEAVE RULES

1. A student should apply for leave when absolutely necessary and should secure it personally at least two days before it is to be availed of, except in case of sickness.
2. Students must get their leave sanctioned from the college authorities on the prescribed form available in the Administrative Office.
3. Application must be made on printed form available in the college office. This should be countersigned by Father/Guardian of the student and tutorial group incharge.
4. In case of medical leave, it must be accompanied by a medical certificate issued by a Medical Officer/ Qualified Doctor.
5. Leave up to three days will be granted by the tutors concerned. Leave for more than three days will be granted by the principal only.
6. A student who remains absent without getting her leave sanctioned for more than fifteen days, her name will be struck off the college rolls.

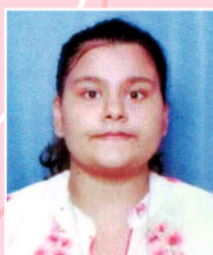

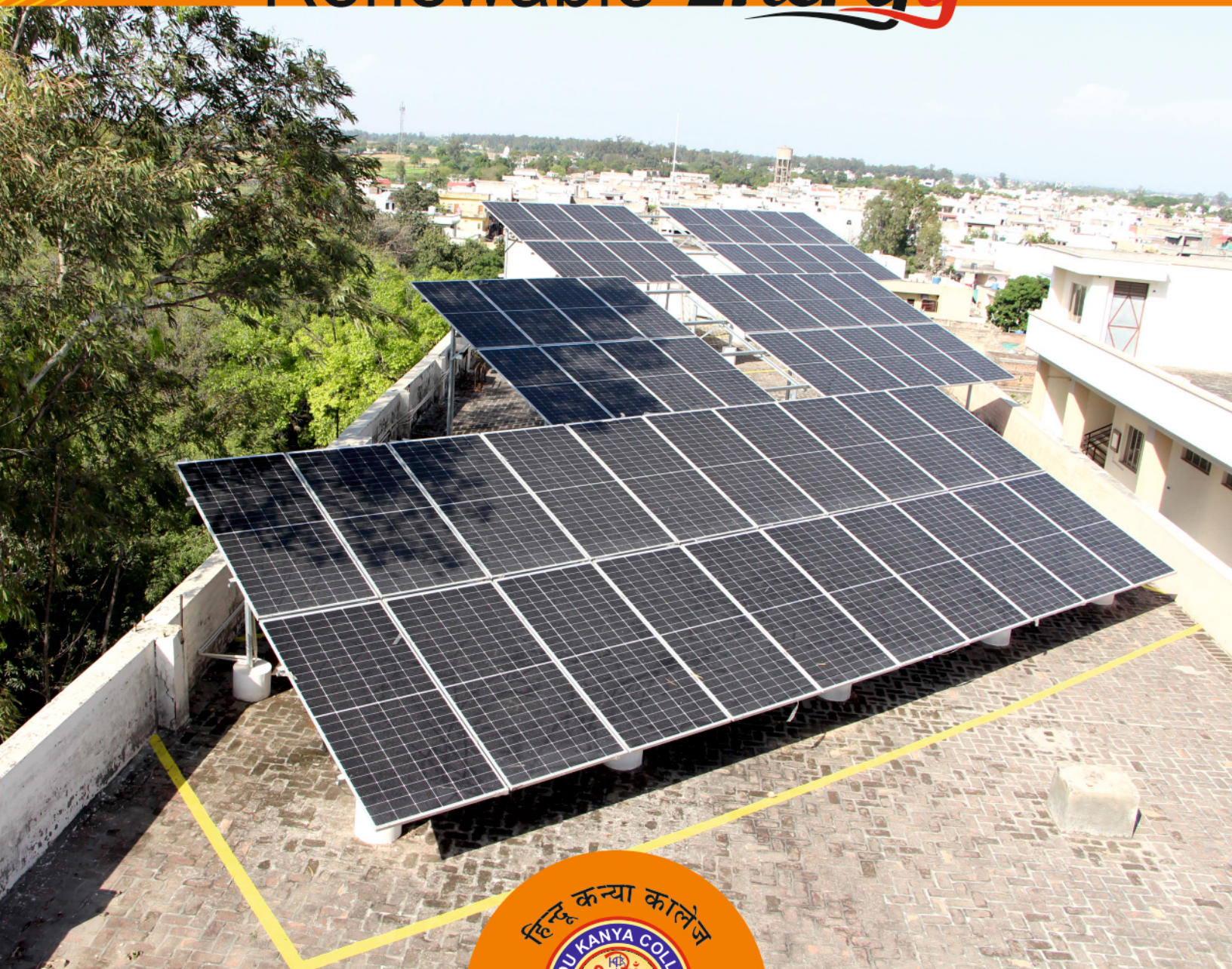
